## Volunteering At LSRVNA...

something for everyone!

<u>Office Support:</u> Done mainly at the VNA office, volunteers help with filing, collating, copying, assembling packets, addressing and stuffing mailings, data entry and more.

<u>Parent Child Program</u>: Volunteers supervise and entertain the children while parents attend the support group, which meets weekly September through May.

<u>Clinics:</u> For flu and other clinics, volunteers support staff by assisting with greeting, registration and paperwork.

**Renaissance Shoppe:** Run 100% by volunteers, the Shoppe is open Tuesday – Saturday, 10 am – 4 pm.

*Lifeline*: Trained volunteers install *Lifeline* units, a push-button, in-home emergency response system.

<u>Good Day Respite</u>: Volunteers are integral to the program, which offers a safe and supportive environment for individuals with memory loss, by helping with activities, meals and more.

<u>Hospice</u>: Volunteers support hospice patients and their families by engaging in favorite activities of patients, sitting or talking with patients, providing respite for the caregivers and more. (Because of the special needs of hospice patients, there is a required 12-week training program for volunteers.)



### LSRVNA Services

Skilled Care, Personal Care & Hospice Care ... in *your* home.

**Skilled Care** is an array of acute medical services which are delivered by registered nurses, nursing assistants, therapists and staff in specialty areas such as wound care, pediatrics, IV Therapy and more. Approximately 20,000 skilled visits are made in the home each year to patients of all ages, newborns to the elderly.

Personal Care offers a menu of non-medical services that assist with activities of daily living to help individuals remain safely in their homes. Services include meal preparation, light housekeeping, laundry, errands, shopping, companionship and more. Each year, approximately 50,000 hours of personal care are provided.

Hospice Care is provided at end of life, generally when a person's life expectancy is 6 months or less. The hospice philosophy celebrates quality of life rather than the length, making every moment meaningful. An exceptional team of nurses, aides, therapists, spiritual care providers, social workers and volunteers help patients and their families cope with complex physical and emotional issues at end of life.

Her knowledge, calm demeanor and compassion convey to the patient and family that they are in expert hands. Here are just a few comments made by fellow staff: "I can't say enough except that I often look to Joy for answers before anyone else." "When Joy is on a case you just know everything will be alright." "A terrific and empathetic listener. You know she cares ... you feel it in your gut." "There's no such thing as indispensable, but Joy comes close."


