A communication workshop series for those who care for loved ones with Alzheimer's and dementia



Caregiving for someone with Alzheimer's or dementia can be overwhelming, lonely, and difficult. The Barn Playhouse and Lake Sunapee Region VNA & Hospice are supported in part by a grant from the New Hampshire State Council on the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts to continue FREE monthly events that connect caregivers and help them navigate different circumstances. The sessions combine insights from health care professionals with improvised scenarios where actors navigate common caregiving situations onstage. The series aims to help caregivers develop new communication skills, strategies to cope with stress, flexibility in relationships, and an understanding of loved ones' changing perspectives.
